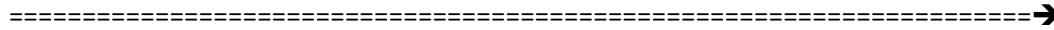




## Volume 2, No. 2 (March-April, 2014)
